### **SOCIAL JUSTICS STUDIES**

### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Whereas sociology is the study of society, the Associate in Arts in Social Justice Studies for Transfer Degree (General & Gender Studies Options) focuses on the social construction of reality and social interaction with an emphasis on how social structure creates inequality based on group membership, such as ethnicity, class and gender. Social Justice is an interdisciplinary field of study that permits students to focus on the intersection of gender, ethnicity/race, class, and sexual orientation, as pertaining to issues of politics, economics, environment, and education. In addition, students will develop strong critical thinking, communication, and problem-solving skills that will prepare them for the requirements of upper division course work.

### **DEGREE REQUIREMENTS**

- Completion of 60 transferable semester units to the California State University.
- Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0 in all transferable coursework.
- Full completion of one of the following General Education patterns:
  - California State University General
     Education Breadth Requirements (CSU GE).
  - The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) for CSU, with completion of Area 1C Oral communication (CSU admission requirement)
- A minimum of 18 semester units required for the major
- All courses in the major must be completed with a grade of "C" or better or a "P" if the course is taken on a "Pass-No Pass" basis (Title 5 § 55063)

- Students will be able to identify and analyze the causes of race and gender inequality in the United States.
