FOR CURRENT AND FORMER FOSTER/ADOPTIVE YOUTH (AGES 16-35)

- Verification Letter - Assistance with securing a "Verification Letter" needed for the financial aid application and accessing other on-campus and off-campus resources.
- Specialized Workshops - Workshops include, but are not limited to the following:
Mental health, transportation, housing, handling money management, maintaining good credit, credit repair, networking, career, and college preparation etc.
- Financial Aid - Assistance with completing the financial aid process.
- Priority Registration - Receive assistance with the priority registration process. Anyone who was in foster on or after their 16th birthday and is under age 26, is eligible for priority registration.
- Tutoring - Receive support in specific subject areas.
- Mentoring - Receive one-on-one mentoring. Attend cohort social events and community service events.
- Supplemental Support Services - Book Assistance, Self-Care Kits, Kinfolk Closet, Snack Shack, Computer Lab & Hub/Lounge.
- Employment Services and Career Counseling - Resume building, shadowing, advising and assistance with job placement.
- Housing - Assistance with finding housing, referrals and priority with year-round housing agencies.
- Networking - Access to services and resources include: Counseling, Admissions, Financial Aid, Gain/CalWORKS, EOPS/NEXTUP, DSPS and CRCDD; as well as community resources.
