



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


SUCCESS: LATTC SCFF Completion Metrics






SUCCESS:LATTC SCFF Transfer Metrics





Course Success & Retention by Gender









Course Success & Retention by Ethnicity







Number of Positive Attendance Sections Scheduled




Proportion of Sections That Reported Positive Attendance Hours




